GENITO-URINARY TRACT PROBLEMS -

UTI (urinary tract infection), Cystitis...

A cute infections of the urinary tract (ureter and urethra), bladder and kidneys should not be taken lightly and it is essential to act immediately. At the first signs Schüssler-Salts are often quite adequate and have established as effective assistants. Should however a treatment with antibiotics becomes necessary Schüssler-Salts are a valuable support and accompaniment.

The development of urinary tract problems is favoured by cold (cold feet, sitting on cold stones, etc.) and wrong wiping after bowel motion. Most frequent pathogens are Escherichia coli-bacteria and cocci.

Three Salts in particular important

- No. 3 Ferrum phosphate 12X
- ➤ No. 4 Potassium chloride 6X
- ➤ No. 9 Sodium phosphate 6X

At the first signs and symptoms administer No. 9 Sodium phosphate 6X and No. 3 Ferrum phosphate 12X (1st stage of inflammation) – one tablet every five minutes in alternation for the first one to two hours (i.e. one tablet of No.3, five minutes later one tablet of No.9, etc.). When complaints ease take tablets in to quarterly to half hourly intervals. When experiencing only slight remaining complaints administer No. 4 Potassium chloride 6X (2nd stage of inflammation) – one tablet every half hour to hour during the first day,

then one tablet three to six times daily.

However, in case of minute remaining complaints – extremely rare with timely administration – No. 6 Potassium sulphate 6X (3rd stage of inflammation) is recommended.

Chronic urinary tract problems

Tip: In case of chronic, recurring inflammations of bladder and urinary passages the biochemic remedy No. 12 Calcium sulphate 6X and/or No. 11 Silica 12X are the minerals of choice; alternatively the supplementary remedies No. 16 Lithium chloratum 6X or No. 24 Arsenum jodatum 6X are also suitable.

Supporting assistants are: cranberry juice, ascending footbaths and birch sap to stimulate the flushing of the kidneys. For deacidification and to contain germinal growth natron powder may be used, especially at the start of the complaints, in order to alkalise the urine: Dissolve one to two teaspoons in a litre of water and drink during the course of the day.

THE SODIUM'S

There appears to be a misconception regarding the use of the "Sodium's" – there is NO time limit on how long they should be used! The Sodium Salts: Natrium Chloride (No.8) – Natrium Phosphate (No.9) and Natrium Sulphate (No.10), should be used as all other minerals till the required result has been achieved. Sodium Phosphate is the acid base balance mineral, and can be used on a regular basis – Sodium Chloride is required for the distribution of fluids, and Sodium Sulphate for excretion.
